Our Belk Fundraiser made \$336 for the Friends, and we were so pleased with the outcome, we partnered with Belk for a second fundraiser on 9 November. It is a wonderful *Win-Win* for the Friends, and we want to send a big **Thank You** to **Belk** for partnering with us!

The last few months have seen the Friends continue their financial support of the Library. We donated \$5,000 toward the digitization of *The Augusta Herald* and \$400 for the library card sign-up event in September.

This is a very real example of reduced budgets and their effect on the Library. Please know that every penny you can donate to the Friends through your membership dues, purchases in the Friends Shop, or tickets to our sponsored events, helps the Friends provide much needed funds to the Library. Without those monies, more programs like the Talking Books will end.

As the year draws to an end, the Friends Council is preparing for its annual meeting in January, so stay tuned for details on that, and there will also be a special book sale in the Friends Shop on 7 December just in time for those last minute holiday gifts!



The Very Hungry Caterpillar Birthday Party! (50th anniversary)


The celebration on Thursday, September 26th at Headquarters (Downtown) Library was an enjoyable mix of stories, crafts, and treats!
