 Letter written to Cornelia Polhill, from her brother John Polhill, from Grooverville, Georgia on September 4, 1848, dispensing brotherly advice.

#### Folder 11:

• Letter written to Cornelia Polhill from her mother Julia Polhill from Hawkinsville, Georgia on May 10<sup>,</sup> 1851. The letter chronicles Julia's travels visiting friends and family members near and around the Okmulgee River. She mentions her children by name.

### Folder 12:

• Letter written to Cornelia Polhill from Eveline Gilman from San Francisco, California on August 20, 1851. The letter chronicles Gilman's world travels on the ship the Delia Maria. Places visited: the equator, Faulkland Islands; Cape Horn; Cape Deceit; Calcutta; Singapore; Liverpool; London.

#### Folder 13:

• Letter written to Cornelia Polhill Miller from her mother Julia Polhill, dated 5 February 1852, from Rosehill. She writes of the death of a neighbor, illnesses in the family, marriages, and news of the day.

• Letter written to Cornelia Polhill Miller from her mother Julia Polhill, dated 27 March 1852, from Rosehill. She writes of family news.

### Folder 15:

Letter written to Cornelia Polhill Miller from Annie Felt, dated 6 June 1857, from Savannah, Georgia. She writes
of a painful tooth extraction.

#### Folder 16:

• Letter to Cornelia Polhill Miller from her brother John Polhill, dated 3 June 1869, Gum Creek, Dooly Co., Ga. He speaks of his desire to be a man of God and of his wife Susan.
