Scope and content: Almanacs were issued annually by American companies to promote the sale of their proprietary remedies. The remedies were secret rather than actually patented, and exaggerated claims were made for what they could cure. Almanacs were distributed free to customers by drug stores. Often the almanacs had a hole at the top left, through which a string was tied so that they could be hung on a nail on the wall. Typically, the back cover of the almanac carried an advertisement for an individual pharmacy. In this case, Perrin & Land or Perrin's Drug Store which operated at 1153 Broad Street.
